

RULES & REGULATIONS

Set-Up Times—July 31 and August 1, 2023

Monday: 12 Noon - 11 p.m., Tuesday: 8 a.m. - Midnight

Exhibits must be set up by 11:59 p.m. on Tuesday, August 1.

The Fair will not provide equipment or manpower for unloading or loading any items.

Hours of Operation—August 2-6, 2023

Wednesday & Thursday: 4 p.m. - 10 p.m.

Friday & Saturday: 2 p.m. - 11 p.m.

Sunday: 2 p.m. - 9 p.m.

Each booth space must have a person in it at all times during operating hours.

Tear-Down

Exhibits are not to be vacated prior to 9 p.m. on Sunday, August 6.

Spaces must be vacated by 12 Noon on Monday, August 7.

Vehicles will not be allowed on grounds Sunday night until police have cleared the grounds.

Vehicle Use

Vehicles are allowed on the fairgrounds during set-up prior to the Opening of the Fair. **Beginning August 2, vehicles with a merchant parking tag will be allowed on grounds, but must be removed by 10 a.m.**

Booth Rules

- 1) Exhibits, including all tents and tie downs, must be contained within their designated space. **No solicitations are to be made outside the designated space.**
- 2) **NEW: Displays should be tidy and free of trash/cardboard boxes.**
- 3) Noise levels must not interfere with other exhibitors. Obstructions or potential hazards will not be tolerated in exhibit and adjoining areas.
- 4) Merchants are responsible for securing their booths from the elements.
- 5) Guard service will be provided nightly Monday, July 31 through Sunday, August 6, 2023. All items left unsecured are at renter's risk.
- 6) Exhibitors will be allowed to take orders for merchandise and deliver it to the customer, if desired, during the five days of the Fair. Officers, directors, and/or sponsoring agents of the Washington Town and Country Fair assume no responsibility for merchandise sold or purchased.
- 7) Exhibitors warrant that all merchandise offered for sale is properly licensed and complies with all trademark laws. Violation of this rule will cause forfeiture of all privileges, deposits, contracts and rights of participation by the violator.
- 8) Money raffles, games of chance with money payoffs or awards (including vehicles), cash lotteries, or any other gambling activities prohibited by State Law shall be prohibited on or about the Fairgrounds.
- 9) Booths may not be assigned, let, or sublet to other vendors

The Management of the Washington Town and Country Fair reserves the right to interpret the above rules and regulations and determine all matters pertinent thereto; also the right to amend and/or add such rules as may be deemed necessary.

PROHIBITED ITEMS:

The following items may not be sold or given away at any time by vendors or merchants at the Washington Town & Country Fair:

- Guns of any kind (including toys)
- Swords/Sabers (including toys)
- Snap-pops
- Whips, chains
- Handcuffs
- Knunchucks
- Knives (including toys)
- Electronic stun-guns
- Laser lights – strobe lights
- Silly string
- Mouth glow tubes
- E-Cigarettes
- Drug paraphernalia of any kind
- Stink bombs (including anything with an obnoxious odor)
- Chemical sprays (including mace and pepper spray)
- Other similar items that may be used as weapons
- Items with violent, graphic, obscene, or vulgar wording or art.

Any other item deemed dangerous, offensive, lewd, or in poor taste in the sole discretion of the fair board or the police department may be banned at anytime.

The judgment of the police department and fair board is final on this issue.

Failure to comply with regulations may result in a \$50 fine.
